#### Introduction

Chase Lane Primary school continues to use its PE and Sport Premium funding to deliver high-quality, inclusive physical education and broaden opportunities for all pupils.

CPD £2617 Staff training to improve specifically Dance and KS1 games

Internal £40158 Top up swimming sessions and upkeep of resources

External £11566 Transport costs including minibus

## **CPD and Staff Development**

Internal CPD was focused on offering staff a range of warm-up games they could all use throughout the day with their class. This was to build confidence in the teaching of PE.

A Dance scheme has been purchased to strengthen a weaker area, this can be used in conjunction with other areas of the curriculum.

A rugby coach is employed to take KS1 and EYFS lessons, these are observed by staff to further enhance their skillset.

## **Inclusion and Opportunities for SEND pupils**

EYFS equipment has been purchased to enhance their outside area and allow the children the opportunity to move and explore different movements and abilities.

Extra swimming sessions were provided for children struggling to swim 25m.

SEND festivals were attended wherever possible.

#### **Swimming and Water Safety Outcomes**

Year 6 Swimming proficiency:

% of pupils able to perform safe self rescue: 33%

% of pupils achieving at least 25m swimming competently: 92%

Internal CPD has supported staff and increased confidence in the teaching of PE.

Equipment and resources purchased and restored will enhance activity across the school both now and in the future

Chase Lane strategically spent £54341.00 of PE and Sport Premium money to improve teaching, inclusion and whole school participation in physical education. As a result teachers are more confident in their delivery and pupils are more engaged with the resources on offer.
